

Adnams, Southwold, Suffolk

Bitter, ABV 3.7%

A definitive hoppy aroma with malty echoes. This continues through with a satisfying balance of flavours to a long, sustained finish that slowly turns to raspberry dryness.

Old, ABV 4.1%

Classic old ale, deep ruby brown in colour, slightly sweet and hints of plum fruitiness.

Explorer, ABV 4.3%

Using Columbus in the copper and Chinook in the cask, this golden bitter is suffused with the aromas of a grapefruit grove.

TallyHo, ABV 8%

Rich and complex barley wine, matured for a year especially for us. Hints of sherry and complex fruitiness.

Anglo Dutch, Dewsbury, West Yorkshire

Best Bitter, ABV 3.8%

Malty brew with a citrus after bite. A real Northern session brew.

Batemans, Wainfleet, Lincolnshire

Mild, ABV 3%

Classic mild with orchard fruit nose and ruby black in colour.

XB, ABV 3.7%

A mid-brown well balanced session bitter.

Victory, ABV 5.9%

Full flavoured and aromatic strong pale ale. With a predominantly fruity aroma with a malty palate balanced with an good hop character.

Batham, Brierley Hill, West Midlands

Mild, ABV 3.5%

Fruity dark brown mild.

Bitter, ABV 4.3%

A pale yellow fruity, sweetish bitter.

Beeston, Beeston, Norfolk

Afternoon Delight, ABV 3.7%

Fruity golden ale.

Worth the Wait, ABV 4.2%

Golden brown in colour with a citrus and honey nose followed by a dry almost smokey bitter finish.

On the Huh, ABV 5%

Dark reddish brown in colour with a smoky malt taste.

Belhaven, Dunbar, Lothians

80/-, ABV 4.2%

Complex malty beer, one of the few remaining 80/- beers.

Blackfriars, Gt Yarmouth, Norfolk

Yarmouth Bitter, ABV 3.8%

Amber coloured fruity bitter, last years Beer of the Festival.

Whyte Angel, ABV 4.5%

Fragrant hoppy bitter with honey notes.

Old Habit, ABV 5.6%

Strong bitter from Yarmouth.

Brains, Cardiff, Glamorgan

Dark, ABV 3.5%

Tasty dark brown mild, good mix of hops, roast and caramel.

Rev James, ABV 4.5%

Easy drinking bitter with faint malt and fruit aroma.

Brakspear, Witney, Oxfordshire

Bitter, ABV 3.4%

Classic copper coloured pale ale with orange fruit aroma.

Brandon, Brandon, Suffolk

Saxon Gold, ABV 4%

A pale golden beer with a subtle hoppy aroma.

Rusty Bucket, ABV 4.4%

Traditional best bitter smooth on the palate and is noted for its soft, but surprisingly fruity flavour.

Slippery Jack, ABV 4.5%

Complex but well balanced flavours of roasted grain and hop bitterness. Dry with a lingering, but pleasantly bitter finish.

Broughton, Broughton, Borders

Clipper IPA, ABV 4.2%

Light coloured crisp hoppy beer.

Exciseman, ABV 4.6%

Dark malty brew, a traditional 80/- cask ale.

Brown Cow, Selby, North Yorkshire

After Dark Coffee Porter, ABV 5%

Full flavoured porter with a not so subtle hint of coffee.

Buffys, Tivetshall St Mary, Norfolk

Norwich Terrier, ABV 3.6%

Refreshing gold coloured bitter with fragrant peachy aroma and dry finish.

Bitter, ABV 3.9%

Pale brown beer with hoppy nose and dry bitterness.

Mucky Duck, ABV 4.5%

Slightly sweet porter with a bitter edge.

Norwegian Blue, ABV 4.9%

Complex beer with a pale brown colour and gentle hoppy nose. Good mix of hops, malt and bitterness.

Bull Box, Fordham, Norfolk

Bull Box Bitter, ABV 4%

A Copper coloured beer, intense hop flavouring, finishing with a clean dry bitter aftertaste.

Buntingford, Royston, Hertfordshire

Oatmeal Stout, ABV 4.4%

Brewed with malted oats, and even malted rye, this is a traditional beer style without the roasted flavours normally associated with modern stouts.

Royston Red, ABV 4.8%

A ruby-red ale, with a cocktail of hops to give a pleasantly fruity hoppiness.

Cairngorm, Aviemore, Highlands & Islands

Black Gold, ABV 4.4%

A smooth medium bodied Scottish stout with subtle bitterness, giving way to late sweetness and underlying roast barley hints.

Festival Special.

North Brink Porter, ABV 5%

Dark ruby red porter with a hint of coffee like dryness complemented by Fuggles hop.

Greyhound, ABV 5.2%

Copper red strong bitter with a distinct malty aroma, dry with soft berry flavours.

Elmtree, Snetterton, Norfolk

Bitter, ABV 4.2%

New brewery based at Snetterton, Norfolk.

Dark Horse Stout, ABV 5%

Strikingly different stout.

Everards, Enderby, Leicestershire

Beacon, ABV 3.8%

Burton style pale amber bitter, light and refreshing.

Old Original, ABV 5.2%

Full bodied mid brown bitter with well balanced maltiness.

Fat Cat Brewery, Norwich, Norfolk

Where's The Cat, ABV 4.2%

Festival special brewed for us.

Stout Cat, ABV 4.6%

A bittersweet stout with a taste of burnt toast, caramel and liquorice, and a smooth malty finish.

Marmalade Cat, ABV 5.2%

Slightly sweet and citrus flavoured wheat beer.

A deep reddish orange coloured ale with a malty, yet spicy aroma of cough candy, cloves, cinnamon and liquorice plus a rich molasses, rum-like taste.

IPA, ABV 5.2%

Nineteenth century recipe with a dry zesty fruit aroma and buttery malt taste.

Front Street, Binham, Norfolk

Binham Cheer, ABV 3.9%

Deep golden ale, good flavour for it's strength.

Callums Ale, ABV 4.3%

Dry copper coloured ale with a crisp malty toffeeish flavour.

China Gold, ABV 5%

Pale coloured beer, flavoured with Chinese spice and a hint of ginger

Fuller's, Chiswick, London

Chiswick, ABV 3.5%

Easy drinking beer with a little sweetness but nice mix of Goldings hops at the end.

Pipe Dream, ABV 4.3%

Light and fruity ale with a hint of grapefruit.

Porter, ABV 5.4%

Traditional London style porter with chocolate and coffee notes leading to nice delicate hop finish.

Classic light mild ale, with a fresh lemon fruit taste.

Original Bitter, ABV 3.8%

Pale brown beer with malty nose yet still bitter at the finish.

Honey Mild, ABV 3.6%

A dark mild charged with honey.

Raspberry Wheat, ABV 5%

An American style ale, delicately flavoured with summer fruits. Made with Hersbrucker hops, wheat and lager malt.

A dark beer with a well balanced sweetness, malt and chocolate tones.

Sunburst Pilsner, ABV 4.8%
