Red Cuillin, ABV 4.2%

A light and fruity tawny red coloured ale.

Black Cuillin, ABV 4.5%

Full bodied Scottish old ale with complex flavour of malt and fruit to be discovered.

Kelburn, Barrhead, Strathclyde

Dark Moor, ABV 4.5%

A beautifully balanced dark, fruity ale with undertones of liquorice and blackcurrant.

Carte Blanche, ABV 5%

Dry full bodied golden ale named after Paisley's river, White Cart Water.

Kinver, Kinver, Staffordshire

Edge, ABV 4.2%

Copper coloured ale with good hoppy aroma and a flowery fruity taste. Named after a local beauty spot.

Pail Ale, ABV 4.4%

Very pale bitter ale with a hint of citrus.

Lees, Middleton Junction, Gt Manchester

Moonraker, ABV 7.5%

A firm festival favourite, rich malty and fruity.

Marston's, Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire

Bass, ABV 4.4%

Pale brown beer with fruity aroma

Mauldons, Sudbury, Suffolk

Silver Adder, ABV 4.2%

Brewed to celebrate the company's 25th anniversary

Octoberfest, ABV 5%

A smooth strong bitter beer with a soft hoppy aroma that gives a lingering finish.

Black Adder, ABV 5.3%

Wouldn't be a festival without this, now would it?. Caramel, malt, blackcurrant and more.

McMullen, Hertford, Hertfordshire

AK, ABV 3.7%

A carefully balanced mixture of pale ale and chocolate malts to give a soft malty taste, while WGV hops give a light fragrant aroma and clean finish.

Hope & Glory, ABV 4.1%

Subtle blend of Progress whole leaf hops combined with pale ale malt and crystal malt give the beer a rich golden colour and distinctive taste.

Mighty Oak, Maldon, Essex

Oscar Wilde, ABV 3.7%

Dark ruby amber mild with a hint of coffee and chocolate aroma and slight bitterness.

Maldon Gold, ABV 3.8%

Golden yellow colour, fruity with a citrus lemon tang and biscuit malt after taste.

Moorhouses, Burnley, Lancashire

Pride of Pendle, ABV 4.1%

Well balanced amber best bitter.

Pendle Witches Brew, ABV 5.1%

Dark full bodied ale with plenty of malt, complex and popular.

Museum, Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire

Worthington 'E', ABV 4.8%

An aroma of apples and bananas followed by a slightly sweet buttery flavour, a lost-classic.

No 1 Barley Wine, ABV 10.5%

A proper barley wine, deep mahogany in colour with an aroma of sweetness and hops balanced by distinctive treacle toffee almost marmite flavour.

Nethergate, Clare, Suffolk

Pub Boar, ABV 4.3%

We all know one of these? *DE. alright.*

Essex Border, ABV 4.8%

A golden beer, drinking more like a best bitter than its strength suggests.

Umbel Magna, ABV 5%

Brewed to a 1750 recipe, this is Ould Growler with added coriander, a classic.

Stour Valley Porter, ABV 6.2%

Dark ruby red porter, that is matured for three months, full of flavour.

Oakham, Peterborough, Cambridgeshire

JHB, ABV 3.8%

Light citrus flavoured golden style bitter, very popular.

3 Witches, ABV 4.4%

Gentle orange aroma, soft caramel melts to a drying finish.

O'Hanlon's, Whimble, Devon

Firefly, ABV 3.7%

Malty and fruity bitter with hints of orange.

Yellow Hammer, ABV 4%

Very popular last year, smooth pale and yellow, might even get to try some myself.

Dry Stout, ABV 4.2%

Dark and malty with plenty of roast flavour's, reminds you of a certain well know Irish beer.

Okells, Douglas, Isle of Man

Mild, ABV 3.4%

Dark reddish brown mild with a hint of Seville oranges.

Old Chimneys, Market Weston, Suffolk

Natterjack, ABV 5%

Full bodied premium ale with a hint of spice and caramel.

Pale Ale, ABV 6.5%

Midway between bitter a and an IPA, golden amber in colour with sweetish taste.

Good King Henry, ABV 9%

An imperial stout, deep black with blackberry and liquorice flavours, not for you Douglas.

Olde Swan, Dudley, West Midlands

Original, ABV 3.5%

Straw coloured light mild with a tangy flavour.

Entire, ABV 4.4%

Amber coloured premium bitter with a slight sweetness to it.

Osset, Ossett, West Yorkshire

Silver King, ABV 4.3%

Crisp, dry flavour and citrus fruity aroma in this real lager.

Warhorse, ABV 5%

A powerful dark bitter, brewed using the Cascade hop. Citrusy and robust.

Otter, Honiton, Devon

Bitter, ABV 3.6%

Honey gold in colour, with a fruity malt taste.

Bright, ABV 4.3%

Very light almost pilsner in style citrus ale.

Oulton Ales, Oulton Broad, Suffolk

Bitter, ABV 3.5%

Fruity amber coloured bitter.

Sunrise, ABV 4%

Fine golden ale with an almost orange mandarin flavouring.

Wet & Windy, ABV 4.3%

Oulton broad certainly is in October.

Gone Fishing, ABV 5%

Dark brown bitter with slightly citrus taste.

Pitfield, Colchester, Essex

1850 London Porter, ABV 5%

Dark brown almost black beer with a chocolate malty flavour.

IPA, ABV 7%

New beer from this well established micro.

Potbelly, Kettering, Northamptonshire

Ambrosia, ABV 4%

Amber coloured mild with fruit and caramel notes.

Eastfield IPA, ABV 7.5%

Named after a local punk band, notes of green apple and citrus, with an almost grape like taste.

Purple Moose, Porthmadog, North West Wales

Glaslyn, ABV 4.2%

Fruity taste with lemon and grapefruit flavours, named after the mighty Afon Glaslyn which flows from 'yr Wyddfa' (Snowdon) to Porthmadog.

Railway Tavern, Brightlingsea, Essex

Crab & Winkle Mild, ABV 3.7%

Very famous, very dark, rich, with lots of burnt, smoky malt.

Fireside Porter, ABV 4.3%

A new beer from Brightlingsea.

Reepham, Reepham, Norfolk

Rapier, ABV 4.2%

Complex amber coloured brew with smoky bitter overtones.

Robinson's, Stockport, Cheshire

Unicorn, ABV 4.2%

Fruity sweet golden bitter

Old Tom, ABV 8.5%

Warming peppery notes with a dark chocolate feel of molasses to finish.

Sarah Hughes, Sedgley, West Midlands

Sedgeley Surprise, ABV 5%

Bittersweet hoppy ale.

Dark Ruby Mild, ABV 6%

A dark ruby strong ale with rich malty flavour.

Shepherd Neame, Faversham, Kent

Masterbrew, ABV 3.7%

A clean, dry, refreshing, session bitter, having a touch of sweetness.

Late Red.

Late Red, ABV 4.5%

A deep sweetness combining burnt notes with toffee and honey characterise this Autumn ale

Spectrum, Tharston, Norfolk

Dark Fantastic, ABV 3.5%

Dark ruby coloured beer with caramel and toffee aroma and hints of berry fruit

Black Buffle, ABV 4.5%

Dark chocolate and liquorice are present in this deep red porter along with coffee dryness.

Old Stootwobler, ABV 6%

Complex brew of dark chocolate, morello cherry and raisin vying along with banana, malt and hops.

Blinder, ABV 8.5%

Brewed only twice an year and we have some again aren't we lucky.

Black Prince, ABV 4%

Malty brew with caramel sweetness and slight hint of toffee.

Proper Job, ABV 4.5%

Proper Job is dedicated to the 32nd (Cornwall) Regiment who stoutly defended their garrison during the Indian Mutiny in 1857-58. An authentic IPA brewed with Cornish spring water and malt.

St Peter's, South Elmham, Suffolk

Best Bitter, ABV 3.7%

Complex well balanced hoppy bitter.

Mild, ABV 3.7%

Bitter but sweet traditional mild

Organic Ale, ABV 4.5%

Refreshing ale brewed with organic Target hops.

Golden, ABV 4.7%

Amber coloured full bodied golden ale with strong hop bouquet.

Taylor, Keighley, West Yorkshire

Golden Best, ABV 3.5%

Clean tasting light mild with a slight hint of fruitiness alongside background malt and hops.

Ram Tam, ABV 4.3%

Dark brown beer with reddish tinge and sweet chocolate toffee flavours

Mild, ABV 3.5%

Rich and smooth with an almost liquorice taste follow a good dose of hops and malt

Jaipur IPA, ABV 5.9%

Award winning IPA with a fine blend of citrus fruits mixed together with a sweet bitter finish.

Saint Petersburg, ABV 7.7%

Full blooded Imperial stout with a rich mixture of coffee, liquorice and malt.

Hanged Monk, ABV 3.8%

Named after a ghost story from the Norfolk Broads. Deep colour and gently hopped to give a sweet mild flavour and a good malty nose.

Lady Evelyn, ABV 4.7%

Very pale, straw coloured ale with a long dryish finish and a beautiful floral hop aroma

Deep, dark strong ale with a long malty finis named after another ghostly going on.

Black Moth, ABV 8%

Russian stout.

Titanic, Burslem, Staffordshire

Mild, ABV 3.5%

Classic dark mild, lots of roast with a hint of bitterness.

Lordships Own, ABV 5%

Rich and smooth the complexities of a fine Christmas Pudding, ruby red in colour, fierce spicy hops and mellow roast barley.
